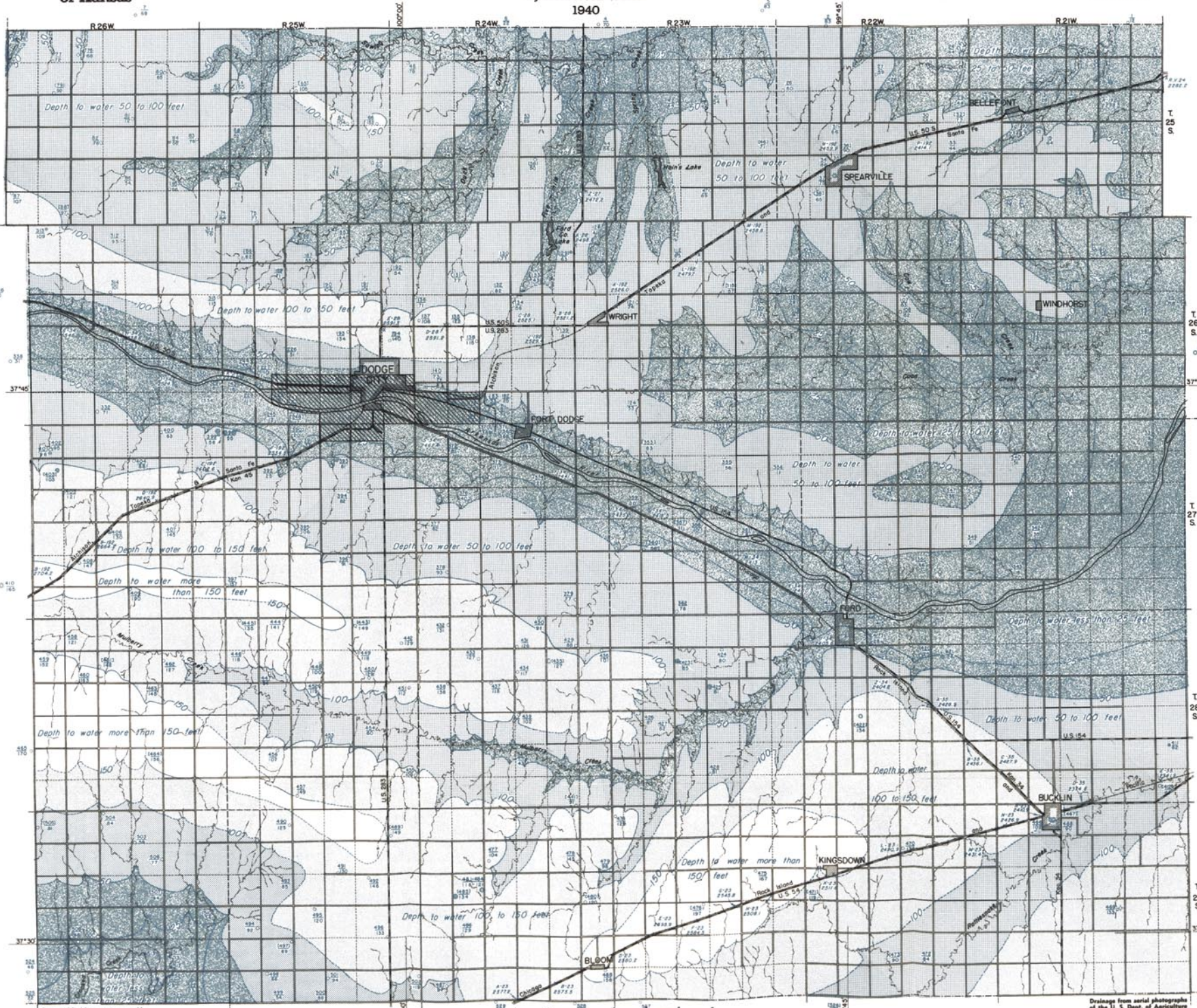


# MAP OF FORD COUNTY

Upper number is well number used in well tables. Brackets around upper number, (25), indicate that analysis of water is given. Lower number is depth to water level below measuring point, in feet.
