

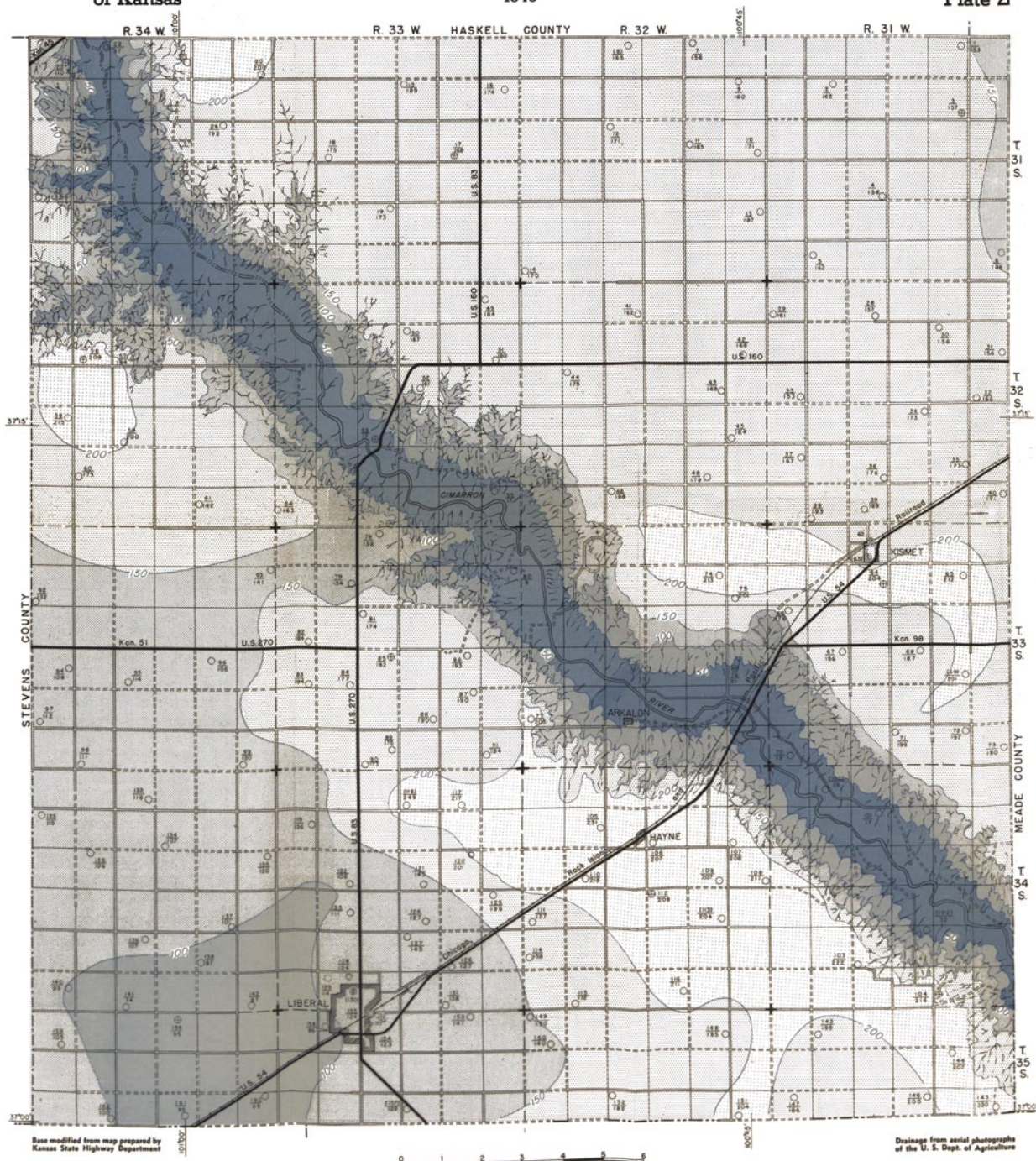
MAP OF SEWARD COUNTY
