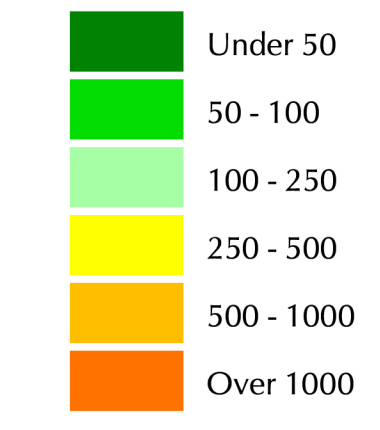


Sulfate Concentration for the High Plains Aquifer in the Upper Arkansas River Corridor in Southwest Kansas

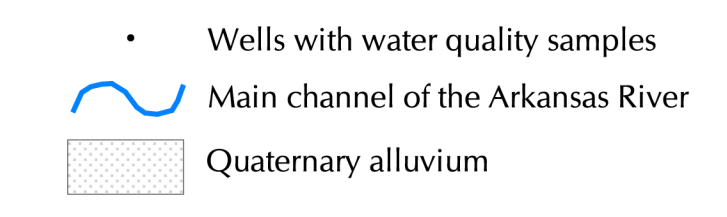
